Call to Order

Review of Minutes of Last Meeting

Linda Curry briefly described the last meeting which primarily consisted of the Livonia School Board Candidate forum and short presentations from Joan Gebhardt and Brian Broderick, candidates for Schoolcraft College.

Election of Secretary

Pat reminded those present that last week Linda Curry had been temporarily appointed club secretary. The election was conducted by a show of hands and unanimous support made it official.

- Treasurer
 - President Pat provided the treasurer's report as Alan was on vacation. There were no expenses and \$345 dues were collected in April. Hats and T-shirts are still available.

- Committees
 - Linda Lieder reported that a small crew from LDC as well as a pack of Cub Scouts did a good job of cleaning up John Stymelski Veteran's park on Saturday, May 5.

- President
 - Pat observed that our April meeting had good attendance. Tonight's meeting, on the other hand, had only 4 board members and 5 additional members. Next month's meeting will have a speaker from the Democratic Party and perhaps we should call people to remind them to attend. Some in attendance thought tonight's topic (discussion and a straw poll regarding the current Democratic candidates for president in 2008) was not of much interest to people yet and that it would be a more interesting topic closer to the election.

Presidential Straw Poll

Pat initiated the process by suggesting that after group discussion about each candidate we would take a vote. Our first choice candidate would receive 2 points and our second choice would receive 1 point.

Frank started by commenting on each candidate's major focus. He suggested the web site www.political1.com for reference. Next, Pat began to comment on his perception of the focus of each candidate. Before he finished, it was suggested that we change the process and prioritize the issues we'd like the candidates to address and then analyze which candidates were focusing on our top issues. In order of importance, the following issues were chosen as most important by those present:

1. End the war
2. Health Care
3. Energy/environment/global warming
4. Education
5. Department of Peace

Many comments about the issues and the candidates were shared, followed by a straw poll. The results are as follows:
